CHANGE ORDER NO. 1

Oronoco Wastewater Collection System & Water Distribution Improvements – Contract 2 and 3
MPCA PROJECT NO. 279777
STANTEC PROJECT NO. 193804990

Description of Work

During the construction of the Oronoco Sanitary Sewer Collection System and Water Distribution Improvements, the City of Oronoco and Fitzgerald Excavating and Trucking Inc have identified modifications to the Construction documents that are required to advance the project and conform to project funding requirements. These modifications have been incorporated into this Change Order to document the agreed upon modifications and methods of payment. These modifications are described as follows:

Item A - Federal Wage Rate Decisions: Federal Wage Building Decision (modification #4) in the Oronoco Wastewater Collection System & Water Distribution Improvement Contract 2 and 3 Project Manual was slightly out of date at the time of bidding and must be updated to modification #6 (published on 8-20-21). Similarly, the Federal Heavy decision (modification #0) in the Project Manual was slightly out of date at the time of bidding and must be updated to modification #1 (published on 8-6-21). The correct Federal Wage Rate Decisions were provided to Fitzgerald Excavating and Trucking Inc. at the Preconstruction meeting. Subsequently, Fitzgerald Excavating and Trucking Inc. reviewed the correct wage decisions and compared every wage rate (including subcontractors) and determined that the State wage rates are equal to or higher than the updated Federal wages provided. Therefore, no change in pricing is needed. As a result, Fitzgerald Excavating and Trucking Inc agreed to utilize the correct wage rates and this change order documents this agreement and amends the contract to include the correct Federal Wage Rate Determinations attached to this change order.

This change order results in no change in compensation to the contractor, no change in the total contract amount, and no change in specified project completion dates.
