

Re: GARBAGE, CURB STOPS, TRACER WIRES, & PARKING

The City of Oronoco has received complaints from Oronoco residents regarding job sites and the materials which are blowing or overflowing from construction sites, dumpsters, and/or trailers and thereby blowing into neighboring property. This is a violation of the Oronoco City Code. Please secure the garbage and look into getting an enclosed dumpster. As per the City Ordinance: **502.5 Containers to Be Kept Sanitary and Secure.** All containers shall be kept clean and free from accumulation of any substance remaining attached to the inside of the container which would attract or breed flies, mosquitoes, or other insects. The area surrounding garbage containers shall be maintained in clean and sanitary condition. The contents of all receptacles shall be protected so that the wind cannot scatter the contents over the streets, alleys or other property within the city. All containers shall be securely closed in a manner as to prevent the scattering of the contents and to make them inaccessible to insects, rodents and other animals.

We have also run into many issues with the water curb stops being buried during grading and landscaping; As well as placement of sprinkler systems or invisible fencing within the right-of-way. All damages are at the homeowner's expense. A tracer wire must be installed and grounded at time of installation of the water line if copper is not being used.

402.9 Location of Curb Stop Box. Curb stop boxes will be installed with rods on the right-of-way line or easement limits at a location as determined by the City Engineer to be best suitable to the property and shall be left in a vertical position when backfilling is completed. Curb stop boxes will be installed at an approximate depth of seven feet below the finished ground elevation and the top of the curb stop box shall be adjusted to be flush with the finished ground elevation. Curb stop boxes must be firmly supported by a masonry block. No person shall erect any fence or plant any tree or other landscaping that would obstruct, or place a structure on, park a motor vehicle on, or otherwise obstruct the use of the curb stop box, or cause damage to the same.

Parking must be in such a manner as to not interfere with the free flow of traffic.
